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# **SCHOOL PLANNING PRIORITIES FOR 2014-2015**

Priority #1 Literacy: Increase number of students demonstrating grade level expectations in

the areas of communication and writing.

Numeracy: Increase number of students demonstrating proficiency (90%+) in the

recall of basic facts specific to their grade level.

# **Initiatives:**

#### Literacy

Continue to use a Balanced Literacy model that will ensure students' learning, Early screening of K's for Phonemic Awareness, promote Home Reading program using high interest books, provide Reading intervention programming, Fountas and Pinnell benchmark kits used in K-4, begin action research on *Response to Intervention*, teacher PD on classroom planning (Universal Design for Learning) and classroom interventions

#### **Numeracy**

Specific focus on grade level strategies for students to achieve 90% mastery in recall of basic facts—addition to 5 (Gr. 1), addition to 10 (Gr. 2), subtraction and related addition to 18 (Gr. 3), multiplication to 5 (Gr. 4), purchase additional math materials to support learning, mental math strategies taught in each class, teacher PD on numeracy

# **Human Health and Well Being**

Intramural programs at noon and after school, Nutrition month in October promoting *Eat Right Stay Fit at Home* bingo game, walking programs for whole school involvement, Active and Safe Routes to School implementation of "I Walk to School Days", encourage Brain Gym activities, MPI bike rodeo

#### **Environment**

Eco-Kids Club, Oak Hammock Marsh presentations, teacher support and class focus through curriculum, Earth Day activities, continue with recycling and composting program to reduce garbage. outdoor classroom plans, work towards the Eco-Globe Schools Recognition Program "Action Level"

- Our professional staff consists of 18 classroom teachers, 1 full-time Music specialist, 1 full-time P.E. specialist, .25 Reading Recovery teacher, .25 Lit Support, 2.0 Resource teachers, .5 Vice-Principal, and 1.0 Principal
- A support staff team includes 1 full-time secretary, 1 full-time librarian, and 3 custodial staff
