

CLASS ENROLLMENT REPORT (2024-2025)

The table below represents the average number of students per homeroom in Kindergarten through Grade 8 across all schools in the Hanover School Division. This reflects the student-to-homeroom-teacher ratio (e.g., an average of 20 corresponds to a 20:1 student-teacher ratio).

When K-3 class sizes exceed 20 students, and Grades 4-8 exceed 25 students, various forms of support may be provided to address the needs of the students and teachers. This may include support from educational assistants, as well as specialized assistance from Learning Support Teachers, School Guidance Teachers, and Literacy Support Teachers. Furthermore, schools may benefit from additional support, such as professional development opportunities for teachers, access to technological devices, and supplementary learning materials to enrich the educational experience.
