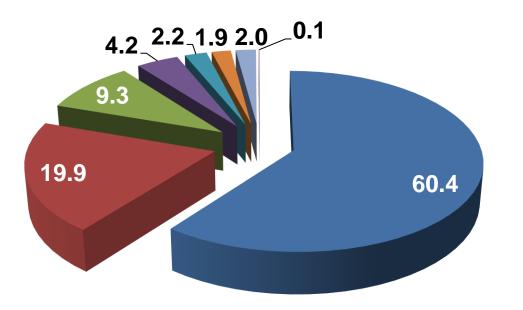

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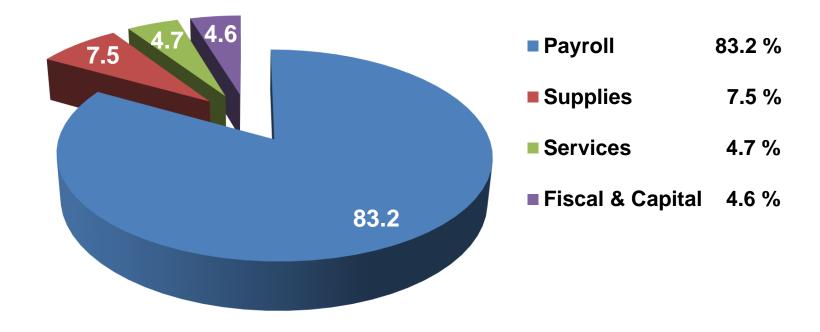

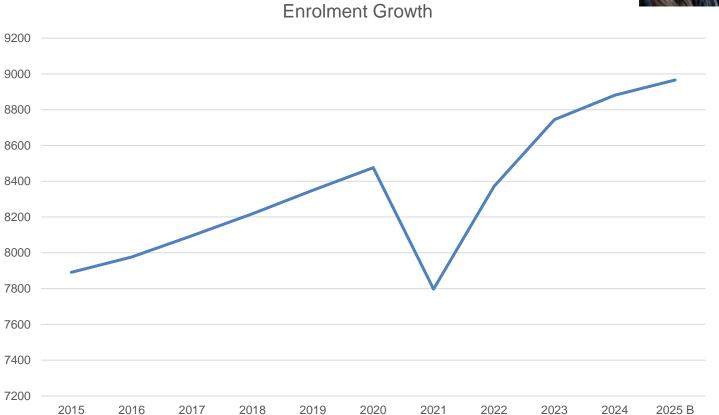

Smaller Class Sizes

Last year the Government has announced the first phase of a plan to reduce the student-teacher ratio in early years classrooms. The department has set aside \$3,000,000 for new hires across the Province.

For 2024/25 Hanover received \$500,000 which provided 5 classroom teachers in K-4 schools to reduce class sizes.

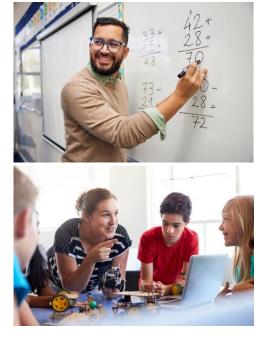

Homeowner Affordability Tax Credit

Beginning in 2025, the Education Property Tax Credit (EPTC) is being replaced with the Homeowners Affordability Tax Credit (HATC) and is being increased to a maximum of \$1,500.

The amount of the HATC is the lesser of \$1,500 and the gross school taxes on your principal residence.
