POSITIVE PROBLEM SOLVING

Parents, educators, and community members share a common goal: to provide students with the best education possible. We all work together to create safe, positive, and respectful environments for every child to learn. There are times, however, when we have different ideas about the way things could be done, and concerns arise. Hanover School Division supports a collaborative approach to resolving problems or complaints.



1 TALK TO THE PERSON INVOLVED
Talk with the person who is most directly involved and most likely to be able to solve it with you. Speak with the teacher first.

2 CONTACT THE PRINCIPAL
Contact the school principal if talking to your child's teacher does not sufficiently resolve your concern.

3 CONTACT THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE
If you have spoken to the school principal, but the issue has not been resolved over a period of time, contact the Superintendent's Office at 204-326-6471.

4 SUBMIT AN APPEAL
If you disagree with the decision of the Superintendent's Office, you can submit an appeal to the Board of Trustees.

WEATHER-RELATED SCHOOL CANCELLATIONS

EXTREME HAZARDOUS WEATHER

Schools will close when weather and road conditions in the Hanover School Division are such that it is not advisable to transport students via school buses. If the weather deteriorates after the school day has started, creating unsafe driving conditions that necessitate cancelling bus service for the return trip home, students will remain in school until other arrangements can be made.

EXTREME COLD WEATHER

A partial closure of schools will be in effect when the recorded temperature at the Environment Canada Kleefeld Weather Station at 6:00 a.m. indicates -35° degrees Celsius or colder, OR a windchill of -45° degrees Celsius or colder. All schools will be closed to students but remain open to staff and visitors.

If parents/caregivers are concerned about their child's safety during periods of extreme weather when schools remain open, they may choose to keep their child at home. In such instances, please inform the school as per regular absence procedures.

CLOSURE NOTIFICATIONS

Parents/caregivers will receive notification between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on mornings of a weather-related closure. Notice will also be posted on HSD.ca, our school websites, and X(Twitter) at @HanoverSD.
