POSITIVE PROBLEM SOLVING

Hanover School Division supports a collaborative approach to resolving concerns or complaints. We set positive examples for children when we solve our problems respectfully and cooperatively.

The problem-solving steps listed below follow HSD Board policy and Manitoba Education's recommended protocol:

1. The most important thing to do when you or your child is having a problem at school is to talk with the person who is most directly involved and most likely to be able to solve it with you. Speak with the teacher first.
2. Contact the school principal if talking to your child's teacher does not sufficiently resolve your concern.
3. If you have spoken to the school principal, but the issue has not been resolved, contact the Superintendent's Office at 204-326-6471.
4. If you disagree with the decision of the Superintendent's Office, you can submit an appeal to the Board of Trustees.

WEATHER-RELATED SCHOOL CANCELLATIONS

EXTREME HAZARDOUS WEATHER

Schools will close when weather and road conditions in the Hanover School Division are such that it is not advisable to transport students via school buses. If the weather deteriorates after the school day has started, creating unsafe driving conditions that necessitate cancelling bus service for the return trip home, students will remain in school until other arrangements can be made.

EXTREME COLD WEATHER

A partial closure of schools will be in effect when the recorded temperature at the Environment Canada Kleefeld Weather Station at 6:00 a.m. indicates -35 °C or colder, or a wind chill of -45 or colder. All schools will be closed to students but remain open to staff and visitors.

If parents/caregivers are concerned about their child's safety during periods of extreme weather when schools remain open, they may choose to keep their child at home. In such instances, please inform the school as per regular absence procedures.

CLOSURE NOTIFICATIONS

Parents/caregivers will receive notification via email, text message, and automated voice call between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on mornings of a weather-related closure. Notice will also be posted on hsd.ca and our school websites.
